

Author Guidelines for 8.5x11-inch Extended Abstracts

EXTENDED ABSTRACT

Below the author information as it is here, use the words "EXTENDED ABSTRACT" as in the title, in 12-point Times, boldface type, aligned center relative to the columns, all letters uppercase. Leave two blank lines before and after the heading and then begin the main text on left column. The extended abstract main text is to be in fully-justified, 10-pt Times, non-boldface font.

The main title (on the first page) should begin 1-3/8 inches (3.49 cm) from the top edge of the page, centered, and in Times 14-point, boldface type. Capitalize the first letter of nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs; do not capitalize articles, coordinate conjunctions, or prepositions (unless the title begins with such a word). Leave two 12-point blank lines after the title.

All printed material, including text, illustrations, and charts, must be kept within a print area of 6-7/8 inches (17.5 cm) wide by 8-7/8 inches (22.5 cm) high. Do not write or print anything outside the print area. All *text* must be in a two-column format. Columns are to be 3-1/4 inches (8.3 cm) wide, with a 0.32 inch (0.8 cm) space between them. Text must be fully justified.

List and number all bibliographical references in 9-point Times, single-spaced, at the end of your paper. Leave one blank line *between* references. When referenced in the text, enclose the citation number in square brackets, for example [1]. References must have full citation. Do not underline web addresses. See below the reference section for some formatting examples.

KEYWORDS: Add 5-6 keywords representing the paper, after two blank lines following the Extended Abstract text.

BIOGRAPHIES

FIRST AUTHOR NAME should be in all capital letters, as shown here, followed by a short but detailed professional biography in fully-justified, 10-pt Times, non-boldface text.

SECOND AUTHOR NAME if there is a second author, should go below the first author biography, and in the same format.
